It has taken some time to get this photo, but this is such a wonderful story that we have to share it.

There was an elderly lady in palliative care last year, who, when she arrived, had her own laptop, but unfortunately, there was no access for her to get on the internet. Her health continued to deteriorate, and she continued to tell the nursing staff that she wanted to converse with family and friends outside of the province before she died.

After receiving requests from different family members, patients and staff, the Advisory Committee of the Hospital and the Friends of Stella-Maris-de-Kent Foundation decided to support the project. Requests then went to the IT department and they got access to the internet a couple of days before Christmas in 2012. The staff were extremely excited to get her connected as soon as possible.

Marthe Leger, Facility Manager recalls "When I arrived the next day to work, the nurse told me, with tears in her eyes, that we had given this lady the greatest gift of all. That same day, she was able to converse with family and friends far away, who would not be able to visit her and she was so grateful. She spent a large part of the first night on Facebook!!! On top of being able to connect with loved ones, it occupied her mind, instead of continually thinking of her illness. She passed away not long after that."

SISTER GAËTANE SOUCY, rhsj 1934–2013

On October 23, 2013, Sister Soucy died in hospital in Bathurst, NB at the age of 79. She had entered the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph in Valley Lourdes in 1955.

Sister Soucy joined the team at *Enfant-Jésus RHSJ+ Hospital* in Caraquet, NB in 1990 as a pastoral care volunteer, after working from 1970 to 1987 in the Mission in Peru. She was very active with the patients at the Hospital and assumed several roles over the years aimed at continuously improving patient care. She was Director of Spiritual and Religious Care at the Hospital, a member of their Advisory Committee and of the Foundation *Hôpital de l'Enfant-Jésus*.

Sister served for 23 years on the Board of Directors for the health authorities in New Brunswick, most recently *Vitalité Health Network*. Sister Soucy also served on a vast number of committees and working groups relating to charity for the poor and other social causes. Readers may remember her from the Joint Leadership Council meeting we attended in Miramichi in 2011. She was very active in catholic healthcare in New Brunswick and all those who knew her, will miss her presence and contributions.

Catholic Healthcare Leadership

This Pillar received approval from the CHI Board in September, to move forward with a project designed to survey the status of Catholic Leadership training and development in CHI member organizations.

Data collected through the survey process will be used to:

- ◇ create a database of current competencies,
- ◇ help inform the development of training plans for organizations;
- ◇ identify gaps in Catholic leadership within member organizations;
- ◇ advise CHI on appropriate program curriculum and delivery models;
- ◇ assist organizations in the development of staff succession plans.
