Les Religieuses de Notre-Dame-Du-Sacré-Coeur celebrate the 90th anniversary of the founding of their Religious Institute this year. This order was founded after many years of attempting to create a French-speaking novitiate within the Sisters of Charity of the Immaculate Conception of Saint John, NB.

Readers may recall that the Sisters of Charity were the first English speaking congregation established in Canada, on October 21, 1854 in Saint John, NB. From the beginning, French speaking women who entered the order prayed and taught in English, in an area of New Brunswick which was primarily French. The Sisters were continually asked by their parishioners to provide education to their children in their first language.



Sister Suzanne Cyr, (known as Mere Marie-Anne) and 52 Acadian Sisters, wrote to the Pope in 1922. They received final approval from Rome and the new Order was officially established February 17, 1924 when they held their first chapter. Sister Marie-Anne was elected Superior General, a role she held until 1936.



The primary apostolate of the NDSC Sisters has always been education in the French language, a contribution to preserving their culture and their faith. They've taught more than 200,000 young Acadians across Atlantic Canada and Louisiana, as well as in Peru, Columbia and Haiti, and are a Member of the Sisters of Charity Foundation.

Mission: "We the Sisters of Notre-Dame-du-Sacré-Coeur, responding to a divine call and as consecrated women in the Church, participate in the mission of Jesus."

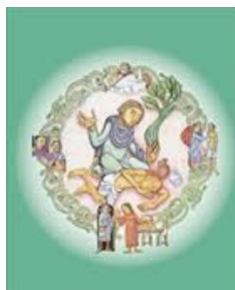
We want to guide our service to those in need focusing especially on those who have little, knowledge and power.

Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph celebrate February 2nd each year as Founders Day, and as a Feast Day of Venerable Jérôme Le Royer de La Dauversière. On this day in 1630 he received inspiration from the Holy Spirit to found the Daughters of Saint Joseph, to serve the sick, poor and most needy under the protection of St. Joseph. The RHSJ sisters renew their vows on this day each year to celebrate the day Jérôme received his first vision.

The 22nd annual **World Day of the Sick** was celebrated on February 11th. Introduced by Pope John Paul II, it is a way for



Christians to recommit themselves to caring for the sick and to pray for them. It is also an opportunity to honor those who reach out in service and in faith, to carry on the healing ministry of Jesus. God depends on us, just as those who are sick depend on us to be the providers of excellent, compassionate care. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Our family of sponsored Corporations celebrate this day in a variety of ways. Most arranged a special prayer service and circulated **World Day of the Sick** materials.

Hotel Dieu Hospital in Kingston ON sent their pastoral workers out to offer prayer within the facility population. Hotel Dieu Perth Andover in NB hosted a multi faith service. The Pastoral Care department at Langlade Hospital in Antigo WI planned a day of prayer services that took place in their Chapel. Hotel Dieu Shaver in St. Catharines ON held a Service of Prayer for patients, family and staff in their Chapel.

Mount St. Joseph in Miramichi NB held a Prayer Service for their residents, where the Pope's message was read in both English and French. Then they listened to the hymn "Great is thy Faithfulness" and after all the readings and Prayers of the Faithful were finished, the residents joined in singing "You Raise Me Up".

Sister Loretta Gaffney, RHSJ, 1920 - 2014

Sister Loretta Gaffney died peacefully in Kingston, ON January 17th. She was 94 years old and spent 76 of those serving our Hotel Dieu hospitals in a variety of positions and locations.



Sister Gaffney entered religious life at Hotel Dieu Kingston in 1938 and graduated from their School of Nursing in 1944. She eventually became a Medical Laboratory Technologist and helped establish a school for Laboratory Technologists at Hotel Dieu in Kingston and in St. Catharines.

She served as Director of Nursing Services in Kingston, Nursing Administrator in St. Catharines, and in

1967 she was missioned to Hotel Dieu Hospital in Chatham, New Brunswick.

For most of the seventies, Sister was involved in establishing and coordinating Pastoral Care services in Kingston and Cornwall. In 1978 she became Archivist at Regional House in Amherstview ON, and served in this position until 2008. Sister Gaffney was part of the move of the RHSJ Sisters to the Sisters of Providence Mother House in Kingston, ON. The turn out at her service speaks to the impact she had on so very many people. She had a remarkable memory and her power of recall stayed sharp to nearly the very end. Rest in Peace Sister.
