CHI's Leadership Formation Program

Due to the global COVID-19 pandemic the Leadership Formation Program was postponed for 2020. However, we are optimistic for next year and are moving forward to provide a French Leadership Formation Program in Tracadie, New Brunswick June 15-18th 2021. Participants, faculty and presenters all reside within the "New Brunswick Bubble" which is currently in the

yellow phase. In this phase, educational sessions can be held safely if Public Health Guidelines are followed. We currently have 16 people registered for this session and can accept 18 in total. The dynamic speakers for this session are Jean Marie Dionne who will speak on heritage, tradition and mission leadership, Father Denis Belliveau who will present on vocation and spirituality, and Michel Drisdelle who will focus on leadership and care for the self.

The second session of the English Leadership Formation Program has been rescheduled for May 25-28th 2021 in Montreal. This is pending on the COVID-19 situation and the safety of travel at that time. There are currently 21 participants registered for this session. Our very knowledgeable speakers for this second module will focus on the core elements of leadership formation. The presenters are Sr. Bonnie MacLellan who will speak on canon law, Sr. Nuala Kenny on ethics, Jamie Hall and Phillip Appleby will describe their Outflow Ministry in Saint John, NB and Sr. Annelle Fitzpatrick will share her knowledge on culture and diversity. We are now taking registrations for English Leadership Program to be held in the fall 2021.
